YEAR 7/8 CLAW REPORT

Arts

Murals are displayed proudly on the wall of the Dowerin Newsagency and the theme is Dowerin and what we do in this community. With painting the murals we learned sketching, drawing, painting, tinting and shading.

In drama, we had Kym and Paul visit the school to work with the 7/8s and show them what Theatresports is all about. This was an enjoyable time and we showed our skills at impromptu performances in space jump. Even Mrs Melvin, Mr Furey and Miss Allister showed off their drama skills.

Health and PE

This semester in health we have been learning about drugs and their effects. We examined paracetamol packets to look at the warnings and the adult and child doses. We have also been learning about smoking and the effects on your appearance. We had some guest speakers ranging from social workers with experience in working with young people with drug problems to police officers from the Northam who deal with drug related issues. This was a most interesting talk attended by parents, teachers and students. Mr Lewis set the scene well by smashing the window!

In the third term we practiced for the athletics carnival. We practiced, shot put, discus, long jump, triple jump and running. The running events were the 50m, 100m, 200m, and 800m. We also practiced team games such as tunnel ball and leader ball. There were some serious injuries in the boys' team due to tunnel ball! Athletics proved to be a favourite because it is more than one event.

Japanese

In Japanese we have been learning hiragana, katakana and kanji characters. Mrs A Hagboom was our teacher. For some fun learning activities we were allowed to play hiragana bingo and we were even lucky enough to screen print on our clothes and materials that we brought from home. In Japanese we learnt how to pronounce many words and then how to put them into sentences. Some of the words were goodbye and hello. Mrs Hagboom said that our Japanese writing has improved quite a bit.

Maths

In maths this year we learned about Algebra, Prime Number, Graphs, Factors, Composite Numbers, Tessellation, Chance and Data and Decimals.

With tessellation we made our own shapes with 10cm by 10cm piece of cardboard, we had to cut out shapes from the card then put it on the opposite side to where we cut out it out from the cardboard, then we tessellated it on a sheet of paper, and finally we painted it.

With decimals we used an abacus to help us learn about decimals. On the first day of learning about decimals we use the abacus and a dice and what ever we got we added to the abacus.

S+E and English

In first term for S+E and English the year 7/8 Class learnt about 'our planet, our survival' and the weather. We wrote reports on the planets of our solar system and newspaper articles on natural disasters. We also learnt about the elements of weather and the earth's rotation and revolution in the solar system.

In term two of this year, the year 7/8 Class learnt about Aboriginal people. We mainly focused on how Aboriginal people migrated to Australia and how they functioned as a society. This included kinship, tools, occupation and Aboriginal history. We also watched a video with Ernie Dingo in it. We wrote reports about famous Aboriginal Australians and Torres Strait Islanders and we studied Aboriginal dreaming stories and picture books.

In term three of this year, we learnt about Australia and its road to becoming a nation. We watched videos about federation and wrote down important notes to go under subheadings like the Women of Australia and the Australian Flag. We then put the information into reports under each subheading. During term three we also went down to the Field Days to learn more about the topics we were studying at that time, for example the environment.

In term four we are focusing on the migration to Australia and we have discussed the impacts that population, lifestyle, social organization and technology have on our environment. We have studied the correct terminology for refugees and others wanting to leave their country. Using this information we made flow charts of what happens to a refugee. Everyone has enjoyed S+E and English this year.

Science

This year in science we have learnt the basics of Chemistry, horticulture and are currently learning about physics. For horticulture our class has planted a vegetable garden. It was not very successful, due to the lack of TLC, though the class learnt a lot about germination and other important skills including group work.

At the end of term three the SciTech Space Dome came to Dowerin. Inside the dome we learnt about astronomy. The Space Dome was a good experience.

Design & Technology

During DGT this year we split up into two groups. One went with Mr Sharod and the other went with Mrs Melvin. The groups swapped over after a semester.

With Mr Sharod, the groups made picture frames and chopping boards. The chopping boards were made to look like foods such as pork chops and croissants. The next group made model Ferrari cars and picture frames. This group also did some wood lathe work.

Mrs Melvin's groups did cooking and sewing. In cooking the groups made soup, scones, muffins, milkshakes, and much more. In sewing the groups learnt simple sewing skills and then produced cushions and bags. The bags could be used for marbles, spotlights, or many other things.

We would like to thank Miss Blee, Mr Lewis and Mrs Pic for accompanying us and for helping us have the best time in history. We wont forget the experience!

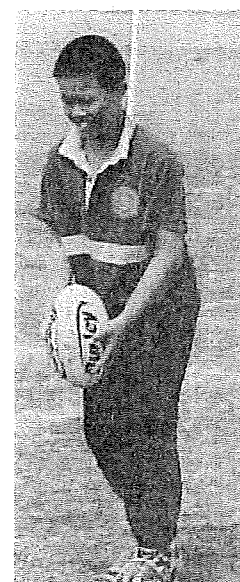
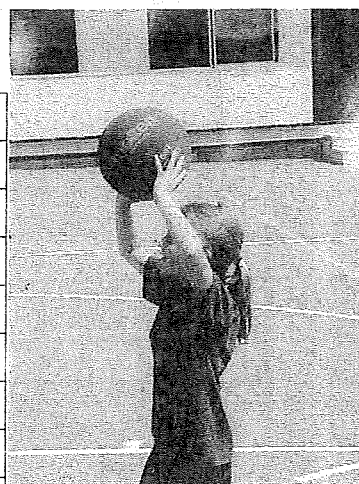

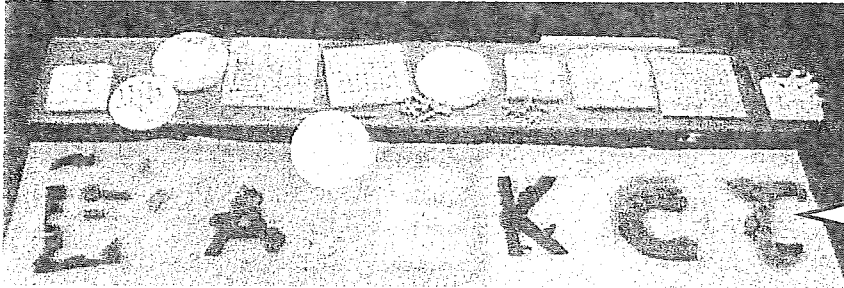
We finally arrived back in Dowerin after three long fun filled days at Bickley. We all brought home funny stories and memories that will never be forgotten.

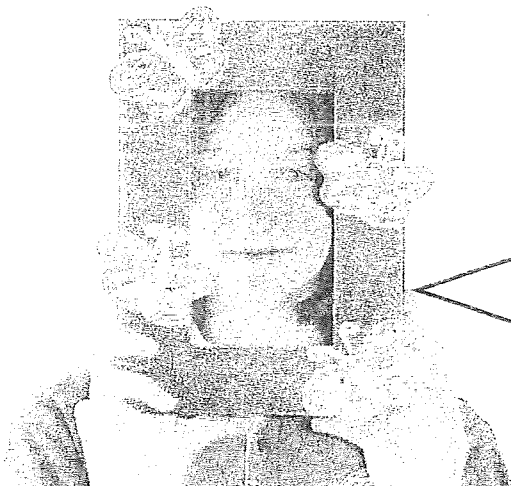
YEAR 6

YEAR 7/8

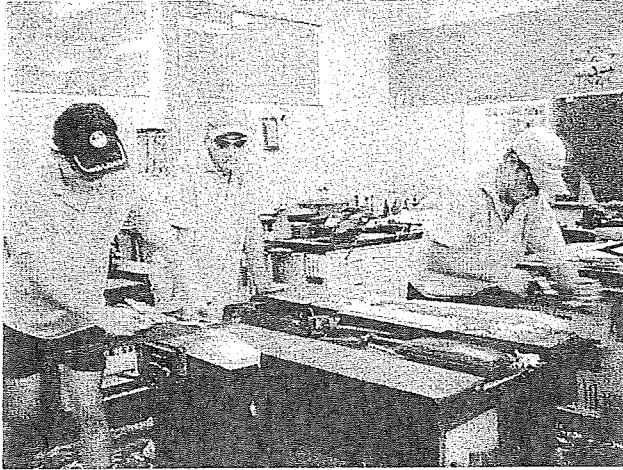

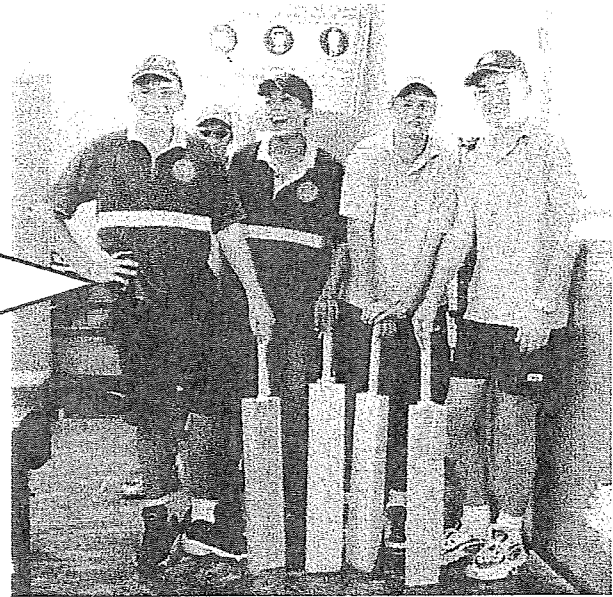
YEAR 9/10

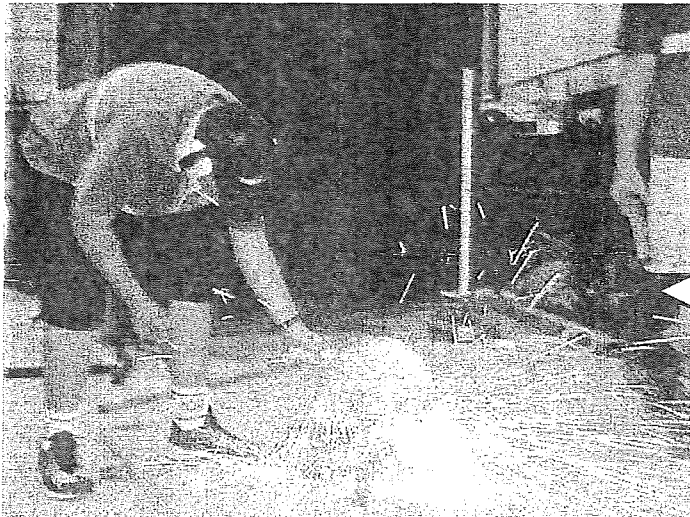

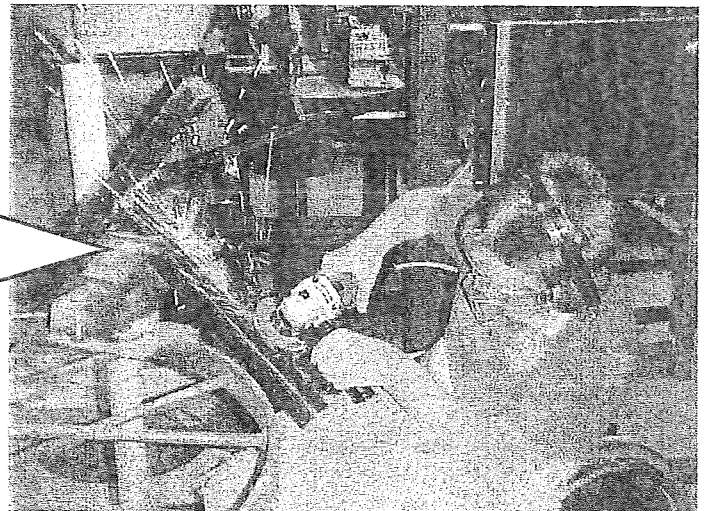
TEAM WORK IN DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY

Robert Anderson and Sloan King's motto, "measure twice and cut once" was practiced throughout the cross-curriculum "Road Show" project as they measured, marked out and cut steel to the appropriate lengths for the portable structures designed by the students that are to be used to support the backdrops of a school drama production.

Scott Iles and Nicholas Anderson prepared the steel for welding by grinding and filing the areas of steel to be welded. This process is considered laborious; however, both *Scott* and *Nicholas* persevered knowing that their contribution was invaluable to the team's progress and final goal.



Justin Braddon and Kaiden Hagboom proved to be formidable welders. The team acknowledged this and gave them the opportunity to be responsible for and oversee the welding process. In addition, both *Justin* and *Kaiden* gave fellow students advice, demonstrations and opportunities to weld.

HOME-ECONOMICS 2001

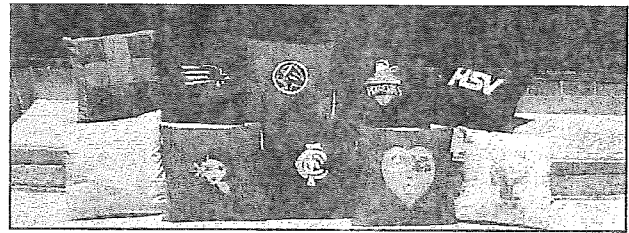
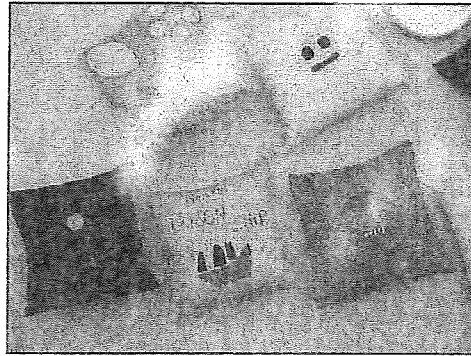
Year 9/10's developed their sewing skills in term 1 by making satin boxer shorts. Everyone finished with great looking boxers that were built to last. The following project built on these sewing skills, whilst allowing for greater creativity. All students made a basic soft figure from calico. Students then had to clothe and add facial features using fabric paint and other materials such as fabric, wool, glue, feathers etc. Different themes followed by students included fairies, mermaids, funky chicks and dolls with ethnic influences.



In second semester students have been cooking – fusion (Australianised Asian), snacks, home cooking and some catering. Students were also involved in-group research about one Australian Dietary Guideline. They then made a presentation about their guideline to the rest of the class and demonstrated such diverse skills as how to use a breast pump and how to recognise the size of standard alcoholic drinks.

The Year 7/8's came up with some very striking designs for cushion covers, from abstract to detailed football team logos, which they executed with care and precision. 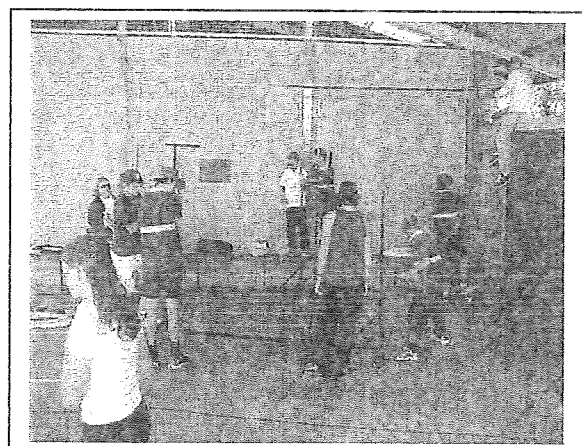
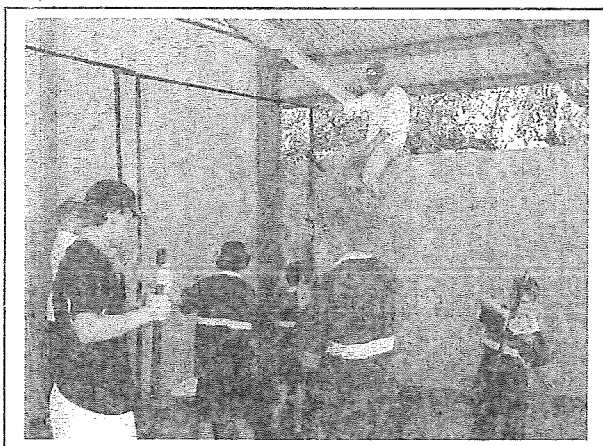

The Roadshow

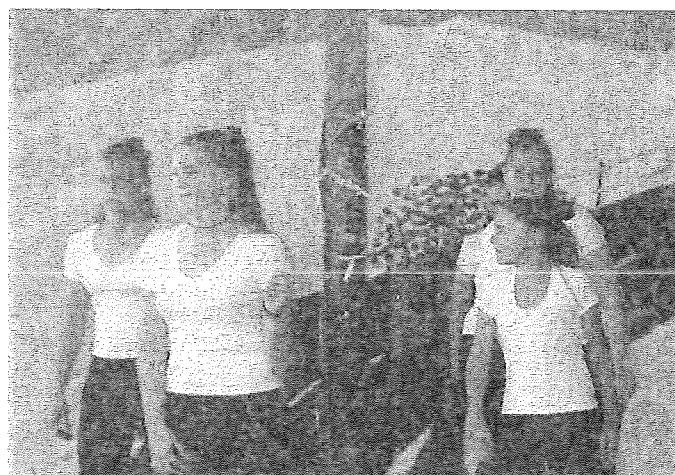

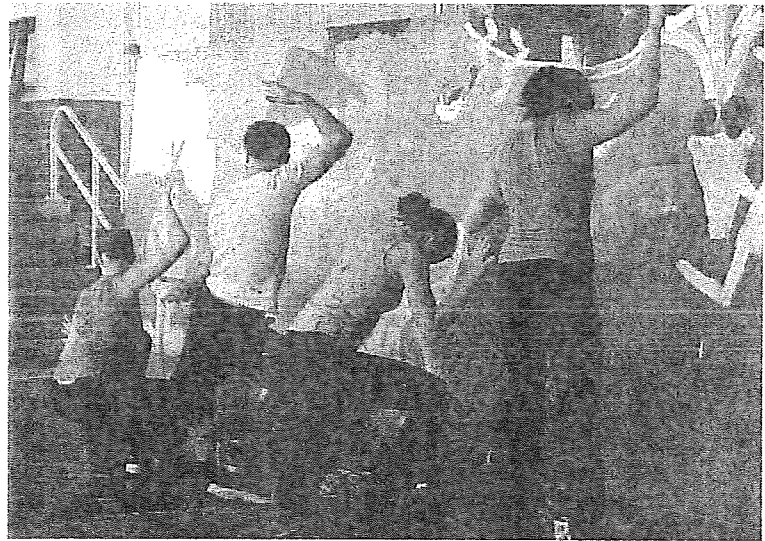


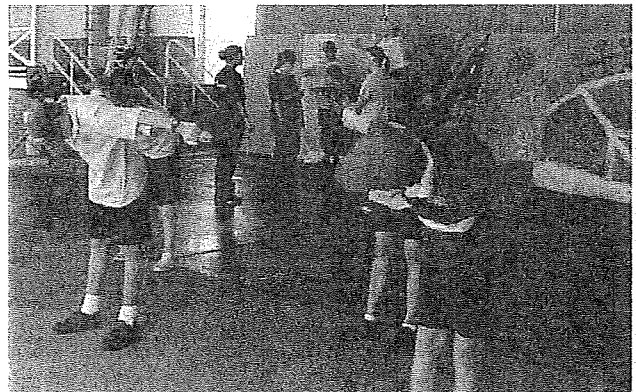
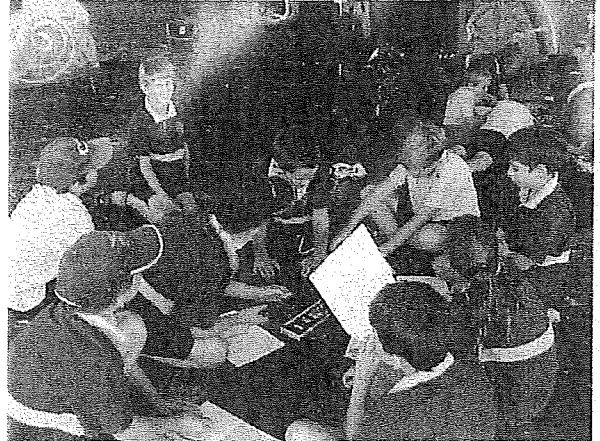
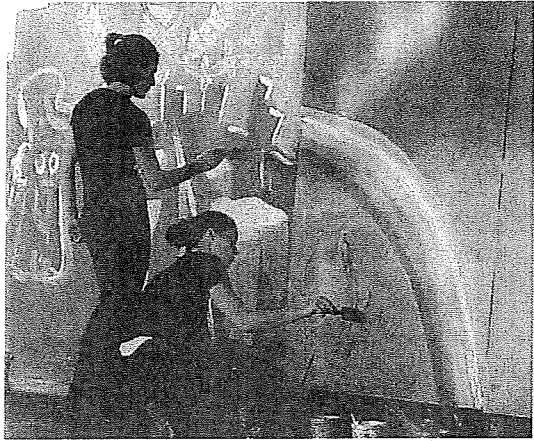
ARTWORKS
